ORDINANCE NO. 2022 – O - 18

INTRODUCED BY: COUNCILMAN SCOTT STEVENSON

AN ORDINANCE CHANGING THE NAME OF HUNTINGTON LANE TO NORTH HUNTINGTON LANE AND SOUTH HUNTINGTON LANE AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, upon a petition of a resident on Huntington Lane explaining that some decades ago an area was quarried out creating a cliff acting as a physical barrier dividing Huntington Lane into two sections with different elevations, it has become evident that Huntington Lane needs to be better identified; and

WHEREAS, as structures were built North of the cliff on Huntington Lane some addresses were assigned that were the same as some of the structures South of the cliff; and

WHEREAS, this has created major issues for first responders not knowing what section of Huntington Lane to respond to

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF KELLEYS ISLAND, COUNTY OF ERIE AND STATE OF OHIO AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That the name of Huntington Lane extending from Bookerman Road south to where it dead ends is hereby changed to North Huntington Lane, and the part of the road extending from West Lakeshore Drive north to the quarried out physical barrier is hereby changed to South Huntington Lane. **(See attached exhibit)**

SECTION 2. That the original ordinance or a certified copy thereof shall be recorded in the official records of the County recorder.

SECTION 3. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of the Council of the Village of Kelleys Island concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of such body, and that all deliberations of the Council of the Village of Kelleys Island and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 4. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and welfare of the inhabitants of the Village of Kelleys Island, and for the further reason that it is a dangerous situation for first responders and is of immediate concern for the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Kelleys Island, therefore, this Ordinance shall be in effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

To Whom it may concern:

I would like to bring a situation to your attention so it may be corrected. Huntington Lane once went north from Lakeshore Drive to Bookerman Road. I spoke to a worker at the Erie County Engineer's Office in the 1990s when I was told the village council had the responsibility and authority to dedicate and name village roads. Some decades ago an area between West Lakeshore Drive and Bookerman Road was quarried out creating a 30 feet high cliff so there was a physical barrier dividing the road with two sections with different elevations. The addresses of the buildings on Huntington Lane were assigned with the east side of the road as even numbers and the west side odd numbers increasing from one to higher numbers as the road goes north. At some time as buildings were built north of the cliff on Huntington Lane they were given addresses starting at one and increasing as they go south. There were addresses on both sections that are the same.

I have been a First Responder for over 25 years as an EMT and police officer. When callers called the Erie County 911 Center on a cell phone for EMS or police assistance and said they were on Huntington Lane but did not know if they were located on the section off West Lakeshore Drive or off Bookerman Road. One caller gave the address as 113 Huntington Lane but did not know which section of Huntington Lane they were on. There are two 113 Huntington Lane addresses that are identical. There should not be one address in the 911 system at two different locations.

A police car was sent to one address and an ambulance was sent to the other to determine where the party requiring medical assistance was located. This should not happen.

The village administration could prevent this from happening in the future by designating Huntington Lane South and Huntington Lane North in the addresses. The time wasted locating a person or persons needing EMS, Fire Department, or Police assistance may result in a critical delay creating a negative outcome.

I would prefer that my address not be changed since I have had this address for over 30 years. My neighbors and I will have to change our addresses on licenses, billing information, and many other data bases if it changes but this does need corrected. That is a small price to pay to prevent loses when there is an emergency at one of these locations.
