#### 7.Q. Legal- D. Lambros:

On agenda today; 1st Reading is a memorándum with City of Sandusky to engage in a Building Dept. on this island. No hurry. Sandusky has to work it through their system. 2nd Reading will be in December and probably won't be passed until March meeting.

Regarding the Referendum Petition: After reviewing the Referendum Petition filed I sent a letter to the County Prosecutor and Board of Elections indicating the petition itself was flawed and didn't meet the statuatory requirements set forth by 3501.38 ORC and 731.29 ORC. It wasn't filled out properly. According to the case law in the State of Ohio, these laws are mandatory and any flaws are fatal. I got an email back from the Director of Board of Elections agreeing that after staff met and the meeting that I attended on October 25, where the Assistant County Prosecutor also agreed with that position. Quirky thing is that it requires a certification from the Clerk-Treasurer to go forward. The Clerk-Treasurer really can't certify a petition that is invalid. I sent this information to Council yesterday. I indicated that obviously there are a lot of changes that need to be made. I did receive a letter of requested changes from the Transient Rental group. I find it compelling and changes need to be made. I'll work on that this month and give Council my recommendations. Council can then do as they see fit.

#### 15. Public Comment:

Tom Mayor: Mayor, glad to hear your comment on airport and Long Point. I came today to address an email that went around on Thursday. One of our neighbors said there was a discussion over lunch this week about a proposal from Village to purchase property for sale on Long Point; move gate back to my property line and turn both the Museum property and property for sale into a public and open State Park.

I bought my property because my family values their privacy.

Museum property has all kinds of deed restrictions from when gifted by the Jones' to keep as a closed preserve. The 11 properties, plus the Museum; on that easement have joint ownership and own gate. If someone buys that property, there is no ability without the rest to move gate.

Idea of moving road at Airport; When Scot's house burned, I came here. I followed tanker from fire hydrant to Scot's. I saw how slow the tanker has to crawl at corner on Monaghan. If we put four 90 degree turns between fire hydrant and NE quadrant of island, we're all going to be in danger if there is another fire. There are open record laws; open meeting laws in state of Ohio. If there are meetings going on between Village,

There are open record laws; open meeting laws in state of Ohio. If there are meetings going on between Village, FAA, ODNR and talk of buying property, moving gates; there will likely be lawsuits under Ohio meeting laws. Mayor Ehrbar states that there is a difference between proposal and agreement.

Lori Hayes: I would like to congratulate Village on the latest acquisition of the extension to the Monaghan Preserve that the Western Reserve Land Conservancy helped to get. 16 acres. Thank You.

Art Clancy: I am here to support the statements Tom made. We too bought our property which is directly adjacent to Museum property because, we value privacy. While I understand there is a difference between discussion and a formal proposal; discussions sometimes lead to formal proposals. I want to make a point that those involved, all of us that live at Long Point extensively, are troubled that any such discussion, whether for proposal or whatever reason, might be taking place without our knowledge.

Leslie Korenko: You talked about an antenna going up? Where will that be? Mayor Ehrbar: Transfer Station. There was some talk of one going off Monaghan Road. Mayor Ehrbar: This is currently at the new tower at Transfer Station.

Brandon Davis: Publicly thank folks in room, particularly Council members Gaither and Smith for their help. They were in on conversations at meetings that we have had related to vacation rentals and transient rental ordinance on the island. Mr. Lambros, I appreciate your comments today related to some of the log we've had. We want to press forward with some good ideas.

Jim Coleman: I heard something earlier about the Museum property being changed into a State Park or something else. The Museum of Natural History is prohibited by it's by-laws to sell it's property. So, anything to do with sale of Museum property isn't going to happen.

Russ Maust: Now that the park is completed; I just wanted to thank and commend all of the people that worked on that project. The park is absolutely gorgeous.
